Next Steps After T Levels

A shift in focus?

T levels will be designed primarily to support entry to skilled employment. Successful completion of a T level will provide students with the knowledge, skills and behaviours necessary to start skilled employment in an occupation related to their field of study.

Post-16 technical education reforms T level action plan October 2017



AWARDED UCAS POINTS

Your T Level will be worth UCAS points – a T Level Distinction* is worth the same as 3 A levels at A* – and will be recognised by universities and other education providers so you can choose to continue studying if you wish.

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

T Levels are a qualification after GCSE that will take your future to the next level.

T Levels include a 45-day industry placement that can help you find and develop new talent.

↑ EQUIVALENT TO 3 A LEVELS

T Levels are an alternative to A levels, apprenticeships and other 16 to 19 courses. Equivalent to 3 A levels, a T Level focuses on vocational skills and can help students into skilled employment, higher study or apprenticeships.

↑ A 45-DAY INDUSTRY PLACEMENT

Each T Level includes an in-depth industry placement that lasts at least 45 days. Students get valuable experience in the workplace; employers get early sight of the new talent in their industry.

↑ 80% CLASSROOM, 20% WORK

T Level students spend 80% of the course in the classroom, learning the skills that employers need. The other 20% is a meaningful industry placement, where they put these skills into action.

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

College Perspectives on HE Progression

A lot of parents are concerned that learners that want to progress onto university would not be able to as they felt universities don't recognise T Levels. Vice Principal FE

You've taken lots of our BTEC students what is it about T Levels you don't like? Head of Student Services and IAG FE

Students are asked to ring universities and speak to admissions departments to find out what courses accept T Levels. There are 2 problems here. One is its difficult to get to the right person and get a definitive answer. Two, most of my students lack the confidence to ring up and argue the case almost Careers Manager FE

Some of my students have been offered a FY which shows a total lack of understanding on their part Careers Adviser FE

Is the T Level Good Preparation for HE?

Absolutely. Yes. If they are going for a vocational HE course. Its an academic and practical course and students are able to apply knowledge gained. It's a tough challenging course and it includes exams. Careers Manager FE

T levels are rigorous in content in content and curriculum and can absolutely meet the requirements of an undergraduate programme. Curriculum lead FE

Many degree programmes are a combination of academic and vocational, so they are a good fit for many courses. Lots of practical experience and skills development and an awful lot of knowledge and understanding embedded in the qualification. Awarding Body HE lead

We are taking the best of our A Level and BTEC students on to this very demanding course. Universities need to be aware of this as many would like to go on to HE VP FE

What about Outreach Support?

- *Most of the IAG support we have provided is similar to other level 3 learners, but evidencing skills and knowledge gained on the T Level in the personal statement is vital.*
- *Tutors need to make sure that the UCAS reference highlights the depth of skills, practical experience and applied knowledge, as well as academic rigour gained on the course*
- *We have had some support from HEIs which has been great. What really works is when it is subject and sector focussed and links up to their offer.*
- *We'd love unis to engage with our students early on and start to build relationships*
- *For next year we really want to be able to bring back students that have made it into HE to share their experiences*

HE Perspectives

We have tried to be forward thinking to say we actively accept T levels we don't want a new qualification to be a barrier to students joining our university.

The vast majority of our academics are fully on board. The few that aren't need to realise that they will be losing out on a growing pipeline of potential students in the future.

Its been quite a challenging journey for us as most of our courses are academic in nature.

The first T Level subjects aren't a good fit with what we offer. We are however expecting to accept students on other subjects as they roll out.

While numbers of T Level learners in London are relatively small, we have started putting together a bespoke outreach offer with schools and colleges, highlighting progression pathways at our university.

We are putting in place, working closely with colleges, placement pilots for business and management and digital courses with a view to opening this up to other routes in the future.

We will be accepting the new T-Level qualifications to enter our undergraduate courses and Degree Apprenticeship programmes.

What are T Levels?

T Levels are a new award that are equivalent to three A Levels. They come with UCAS tariff points and can be used for entry to Higher Education courses.

Along with A-levels, BTECs and apprenticeships, students can now choose to study T Levels at selected schools, colleges and other providers across England. We welcome students applying to Brunel with T Level qualifications and expect the first students to be applying for entry in September 2022.

What are T Levels?

Introduced in September 2020, T Levels are a new two-year course available to students following on from GCSEs, as an alternative to A-levels. Similar to BTEC National Extended Diplomas, they're equivalent to three A-levels.

The qualification is split into 80 per cent classroom-based learning and the remaining 20 per cent is spent on a 45-day placement with an employer. The T Level programme is intended to help you develop the knowledge and technical skills required for skilled

To support students, schools and colleges with understanding options for progression into higher education from T Levels, we have produced a list of higher education providers that have confirmed that they will consider T Levels for entry onto at least one course at their institution. This list is not exhaustive, and there are likely to be differing entry requirements for different providers and courses. We would encourage students to look at UCAS and at their preferred higher education provider's website for more information on entry requirements. Admissions offices can be contacted directly should students require further information on entry requirements. This list will be updated on a regular basis as more providers confirm that they will accept T Levels.



