




BTEC STUDENTS

A significant minority of the student body enter with at least one BTEC, so these students cannot be ignored.

APPROACH

The Student Success Research Team carry out action-research to identify the institutional factors causing awarding and continuation gaps, to report on findings and to make recommendations for change. Within our evaluation framework we adopt a Theory of Change approach focused on “interventions”.

Student Success Research Theme: BTEC entry qualifications

Interventions designed to address differentials borne out of students' entry qualifications and improve BTEC transitions.

SENSE OF BELONGING

Confidence, Failure & The Imposter – a workshop with guest lecturer, Kate Atkin, discussing The Imposter Syndrome: What it is and isn't, where it comes from, and what you can start to do about it.

Kickstart - a two day event that aims to introduce a targeted group of students to resources and establishes relationships and a sense of belonging (particularly those who are BAME/WP/BTEC).

RESEARCH

BTEC FOCUS SURVEY by School of Psychology June 2020

“The worse impacted modules tended to be those where the ‘coursework’ element consisted partly or entirely of in-class tests ... and those where there was a heavy exam weighting. This deficit could be a reflection of the fact that many BTEC courses do not have an exam component, so these students (particularly those whose only qualification is a BTEC one) may be under prepared for or be lacking in practise of examinations.”

RESEARCH & STAFF INTERVENTIONS

IN PROGRESS 2021-22

- Data analysis of module Assessment Patterns and types of assessment to see if these are representative of student's pre-university skill sets
- Focus group BTEC student Stage 1 and Stage 2 by Student Success Central Team
- BTEC/ Access Information evening for Academic Staff working with Students who entered HE via Access/ BTEC courses

ACADEMIC SKILLS SUPPORT

Series of skills workshops: following Expectation Survey analysis the Student Success central team and Subject Areas will work with the Student Learning Advisory Service (SLAS) team to provide skills sessions to increase in students' academic skills for success with aim to increase academic confidence.
