



University of Essex and School Partnerships

- Honed the way we have worked with schools over the years
 - Schools Membership Scheme (since 2015)
 - A network of 30+ key colleges and schools
 - Key outreach targets and high recruiting schools
 - Priority for key events, regular newsletters, designated contact at the University, two meetings per year with key contacts in school
 - Outreach Partnership Programme (since 2021)
 - Schools are targeted based on WP criteria only (not recruitment criteria) – most are pre-16 schools only
 - Currently 13 schools – extending to 16 schools in 2023/24
 - Most of our Outreach activity (especially raising attainment activity) directed at these schools
 - More intense, progressive activity – aimed at smaller numbers of students







The Book Club

In partnership with **Harwich and Dovercourt School and Colchester Academy**

- Pilot project – May-July 2023
- 15 Year 10 students from each school (4 sessions in-school, 1 on-campus)
- Aimed to raise attainment in GCSE English by improving knowledge of key text (*An Inspector Calls*)

Partner	Role
Target schools	Co-created Scheme of Work; identified students; liaised with students and parents; organised facilities for in-school sessions; provided evaluation data
UoE students and academic departments	UoE students hired and trained to create and deliver individual sessions based on Scheme of Work; academics in LIFTs helped identify and encourage students to apply
Make Happen	Provided funding for pilot project and evaluation support
