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I.30 The Decolonisation Education Collective (DEC)

The Decolonising Education Collective's (DEC) presentation will focus on the work the studentstaff collective has done to advance the decolonisation of the Education Department's curriculum. This had been accomplished through workshop-trainings delivered within and outside of the department as well as through core DEC members involvement in supporting Year I UG students to develop implementable decolonisation teacher lessons plans for secondary schools. In November 2022, DEC won an *Inclusive Impact Award* for their contribution towards advancing purposeful change in Equality, Diversity and Inclusion at the University of York. Additionally, since 2021, through the Education departments cooperation and generous funding, DEC members have secured paid internships wherein they have thoroughly reviewed all first- and second-year BA and BSc modules and provided staff with a detailed report of recommendations for how to revise their courses to include more diverse, globally relevant and decolonised teaching content. DEC student's will present some of their best practice work in this area – as well as the challenges in getting buyin for this necessary work.
